

FORUM: INNOVATION IN THE GRID

TUESDAY 28 JUNE 2016

The electricity and energy sectors are rapidly changing due to recent advances in technology. An increasingly interconnected world, the continuing transition of the grid, and innovations in energy production and storage will have a major impact on industry.

There are a number of Standards Australia technical committees undertaking work to revise and draft new Australian Standards in this area. These committees also provide input to the work of the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC).

Standards Australia is hosting a forum to brief stakeholders on current Australian and international standards development work in these sectors. The forum and consultations with the relevant stakeholders will position Australia to be able to manage these changes.

Key committee chairs and members will provide updates on their committee activities. The presentations will be followed by an open forum discussion where all participants will have an opportunity to share their views on the forthcoming changes in technology and the role of standards in supporting such innovation.

The forum will also examine potential cooperation on international standards development activities including identifying IEC technical committees relevant to Australia.

All interested stakeholders are welcome to participate in the forum. Views expressed during the forum discussions will assist in shaping the future standards development work in this important area.
